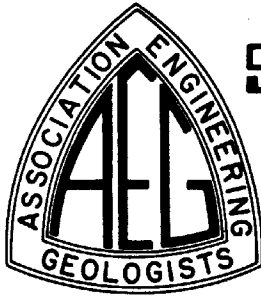

C.D.M.G. HAPPENINGS

TRINDA BEDROSSIAN, CHUCK ARMSTRONG, and OSCAR HUBER of the California Division of Mines and Geology have written a second edition of CDMG Note 54 entitled "Guidelines for Geologic Reports Prepared for Timber Harvesting Plans." Copies are available free from CDMG.

The State Geologist, DR. JAMES F. DAVIS, has announced three new supervising geologists for California Division of Mines and Geology: ROBERT H. SYDNOR was named District Geologist for San Francisco; RAY SEIPLE was appointed Programs Coordination Officer in Sacramento HQ; and BRIAN TUCKER of MIT was named Geophysics Officer. SEIPLE and SYDNOR are Southern California AEG Members.

CALIFORNIA GEOLOGY MAPS

A new 1982 Geologic Map Index of California is available free from the USGS. It covers all geologic maps through 1978 except for many open-file maps. This is the first compilation of its kind for California and 1,102 maps are indexed.

The Olaf P. Jenkins Geologic Map Atlas of California was completed several years ago by CDMG. They are now re-mapping the entire state at the same 1:250,000 scale, but will utilize rock-stratigraphic units instead of the time-stratigraphic units on the OPJ edition. The Sacramento Sheet was completed in 1981 and the Santa Rosa Sheet was sent to the engravers in November 1982. CDMG District Geologist ROBERT SYDNOR has announced that the San Bernardino Sheet is now in blueprint review form and is being checked by outside reviews. Interested geologists should contact CHARLES JENNINGS, CDMG Senior Geologist in San Francisco for details about the San Bernardino Sheet. JENNINGS telephone number in the Ferry Building is 415-557-2293. Field work on the Weed Sheet is currently in progress by DAVID WAGNER and EUGENE HSU is working on the Kingman Sheet.

SPECIAL STUDY ZONES

EARL W. HART, Senior Geologist with CDMG in San Francisco, has announced that there are thirty new or revised Alquist-Priolo Special Studies Zone quadrangles issued for preliminary review on January 1, 1983. These SSZ are located only in the northern Coast Ranges of California within the following counties: Humboldt, Mendocino, Lake, Sonoma, Napa, and Solano. There are no new or revised SSZ in central or southern California. CDMG will focus their review of Holocene faulting in the Sierra Nevada (both east and west sides) during 1983 and a great many quadrangles are anticipated to be added to the SSZ.

LEGISLATION

AB 101 (Moore, Bates, W. Brown, Farr and Felando). This Bill would enact the Landslide Identification Act which would require the Division of Mines and Geology to delineate landslide hazard areas within urban areas. The Legislation and Building Code Committees are oposed to this bill and encourage members to write to the authors with opinions. Copies of the bill can be obtained from HUGH ROBERTSON.

AB 226 This bill proposes to sunset all regulatory boards throughout the State government. The Geology Board would be Sunseted in June of 1988 if the bill passes. More later.

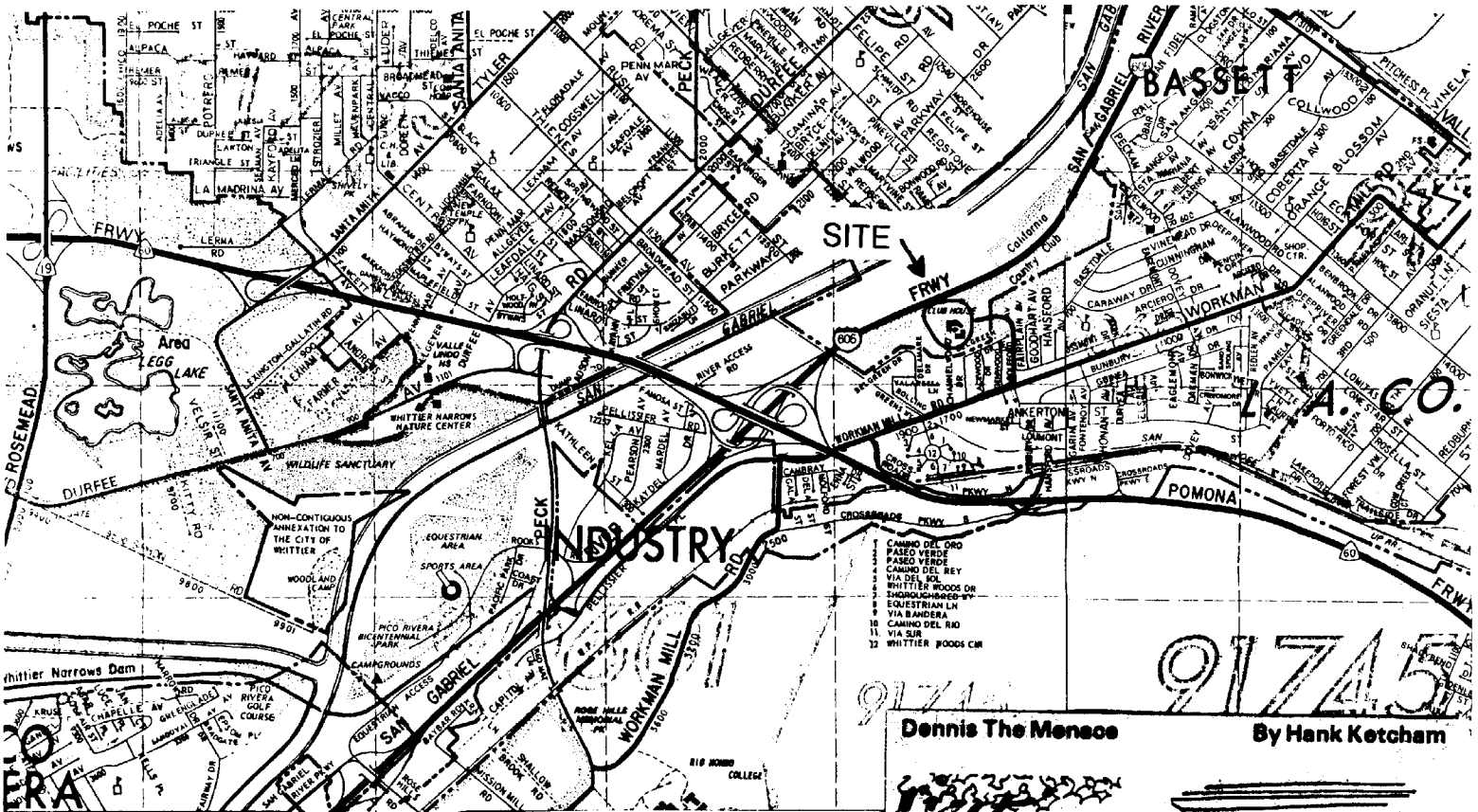

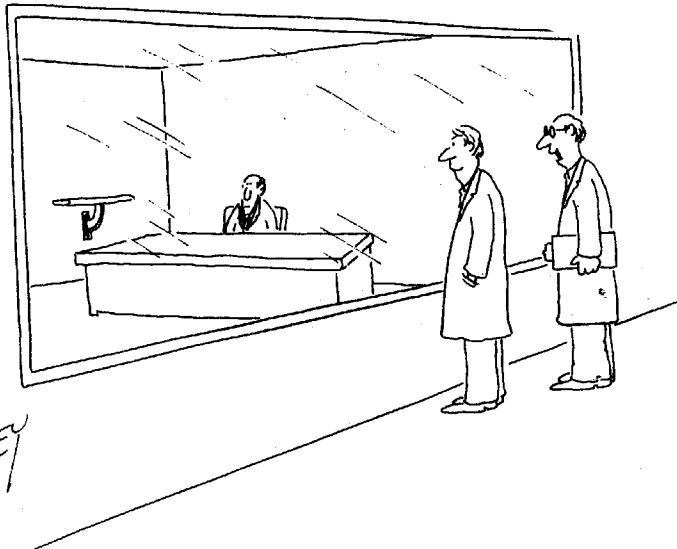

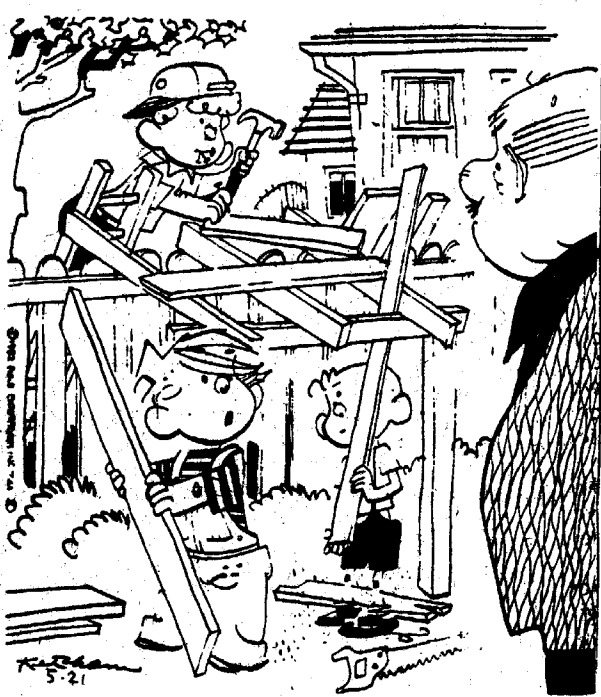
